# **DDA MISSION** & VISION

The Downtown Development **Authority (DDA) supports business** owners, projects, and partnerships that further the economic growth and stability of a thriving Hamtramck.

### 2021-2022 DDA Projects & Accomplishments:

- SECURED A GRANT OF \$5K from the Michigan Municipal League Foundation. Ran a community-wide art project (called 'Racks for Rides') to re-imagine the surface design of existing bike racks. Installed several new bike racks to support the city's master plan goals to increase biking infrastructure.
- DEVELOPED A GRANT PROGRAM for the improvement or replacement of existing brick and mortar facades and signs. Provided local businesses with 50% of the funds needed for signage or façade improvement and installation. Offered 5 grants per year to all eligible businesses.
- LEVERAGED DDA/CITY SOCIAL MEDIA channels to promote local retail businesses. Increased visibility of local businesses to over 16,700 people across Hamtramck and Metro-Detroit.
- BUILT A VIRTUAL INVENTORY AND DATABASE of all brick-andmortar business' contact information and real estate assets. Improved multilingual marketing and communication between the DDA and merchant-owned businesses.
- 2019-PRESENT: Commissioned snow removal and sidewalk clearing services, ensuring safe and walkable public spaces across the downtown business district.

#### **Works in Process:**

- DEVELOPING a rapid-delivery text messaging tool to amplify news related to safety, community clean-ups, public meetings, business compliance reminders, and volunteerism opportunities.
- CONDUCTING a 2022 multi-lingual outreach survey of the business district to understand merchant needs and priorities for the promotion and improvement of downtown Hamtramck.

## The DDA Consists of Two Sub-Committees:

#### **ORGANIZATION & PROMOTION**

- This committee focuses on cultivating public and private partnerships, oversees community volunteerism, and identifies economic development resources.
- It positions our downtown commercial district as the hub of economic activity and helps to showcase the city's unique cultural characteristics.

#### **ECONOMIC VITALITY & DESIGN**

- This committee focuses on building capital, incentives, and other economic and financial tools to assist new and existing Merchant businesses.
- It catalyzes property development and creates a supportive environment for entrepreneurs and innovators to thrive.
- It also supports community transformation by enhancing physical and visual assets that make the downtown commercial district unique and inviting.
